FTTB/FTTN/FTTC

- If it is established that your line is not capable of supporting your chosen speed tier you will have the option to remain on your selected plan, move to a lower speed plan at no cost (if available) or cancel your service and exit your contract (if applicable) without penalty.

Technical limitations

- NBN services will not function during a power failure unless the NBN service is connected using FTTP and an NBN battery backup power supply unit is also installed and working. Battery backup is not available with OntheNet NBN services. You should consider having an alternative form of communication such as a mobile phone.
- Your speed or performance may be reduced by factors such as the standard of your in-building cabling, the quality of the router, electrical interference, or physical factors such as the distance between the router and Wi-Fi connected devices. Talk to us about what you can do to improve performance. For example, elevating your router above the ground may improve your speed as electrical objects such as a fridge can act as a damper. Medical alarms & Security systems

- Before ordering your NBN service, you should find out if any medical or security alarm services you want to use are compatible with an NBN service. If your medical or security alarm services are not compatible with an NBN service, you should identify what alternatives are available. You can do this by contacting the provider of your medical or security alarm service.
